ALL SOULS' DAY MEMORIAL CANDLES

he Catholic Church adopted the use of candles early in its history. Today, in our Catholic churches there are sections for the lighting of candles for intercessory prayers, and for deceased loved ones and others. At St. Nicholas, one such section is at the statue of Our Lady.

Candles are important in Catholic rites and ceremonies. At Baptism, the Paschal Candle is lit and from that flame a lighted candle is presented to the newly

baptized – representing the Light of Christ received – the light of faith. At a Catholic funeral the Pascal Candle is again lit to remind all present that the departed Christian received the Light of Christ, the light of faith and thus promise of life eternal through that faith. Candles can symbolize



life, light, and prayers. They are also used as a sign of reverence and celebration.

In honor of All Souls' Day (Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed) we will have tables in the Narthex of the church for the Memorial Candles. The Memorial Candles can be dedicated in honor of a deceased loved one or friend. At the same time they can serve to remind us that for departed loved ones and

friends "life has changed not ended" and the light still burns brightly. The Memorial Candle has space to inscribe the person's name. Some folks have also written a prayer or remembrance on the candle.

The candles will be lit and blessed prior to the Mass of All Souls' Day, Friday November 1st and will continuously burn inside the church for approximately six days. Of course, at the time of purchase, you are welcome to take the candle with you, instead of having it burn in your home. The candles meet all purity and safety requirements. The Memorial candles will be available after weekend Masses beginning on October 5th and continuing through October 27th. You can also purchase the candles in the Parish Office. The suggested donation for a candle is \$10.00.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus, Virgin and Doctor of the Church

St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus (1873-1897), also known as the "Little Flower," was the youngest of Sts. Zélie and Louis Martin's five daughters. Zélie died of breast cancer when Thérèse was only four years old, a blow from which Thérèse took years to recover.



The family moved to Lisieux, to be closer to Zélie brother and his family. After their mothers' death, Thérèse became very close to her sister, Pauline, but five years later, Pauline entered the Carmel of Lisieux. Eventually, all five sisters would become nuns, four of them at the Lisieux Carmel. Because she was so young, Thérèse has to obtain permission from the diocesan bishop to join the Carmel, and she was able to at age fifteen. As a Carmelite nun, she overcame the narrow, negative spirituality prevalent in nineteenth-century France, and focused on love—her love of God and God's love for her. She called her path of holiness the "Little way," referring to her belief that every act, no matter how small, brings us as close to God as do heroic acts performed by spiritual giants such as St. Ignatius of Loyola or St. Teresa of Avila. She developed tuberculosis when she was only twenty-four and was unable to join a Carmel in the missionary territory of Vietnam. A year later, when only twenty-five, she died of the disease, after suffering through a period in which she doubted the existence of heaven. Thérèse left behind a memoir, *L'histoire d'une âme (The Story of a Soul*), which she wrote under obedience to her sister, Pauline, who had become prioress. It

was published posthumously, after heavy editing by her sisters brought it into conformity with their idea of piety, but recent editions have restored the original material. Translated into over fifty languages, it has inspired faith in skeptics and strengthened the souls of believers. Because of her missionary spirit, Thérèse of Lisieux is the patron saint of the missions. Pope John Paul II declared her a Doctor of the Church in 1997, one of only three women so honored, along with Teresa of Avila and Catherine of Siena.




