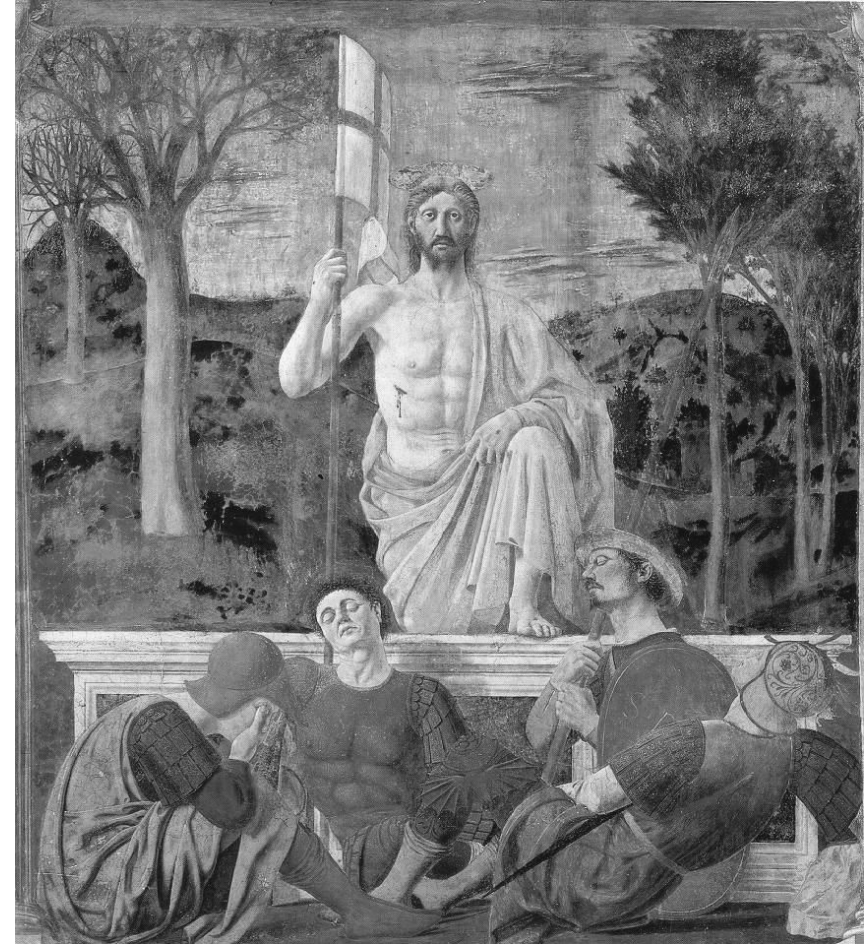

## THE LUCERNARIUM

*The liturgy begins out side. First the fire, which symbolizes the Light of Christ is blessed. Second the large Paschal Candle is blessed and lit. The Paschal Candle is then carried in procession into the church with the ministers and people following in procession with unlit candles. Once the candle has reach the center of the Church, the people light their candles.*

*The Easter Proclamation announces the Good News of Jesus' resurrection and triumph over evil.*

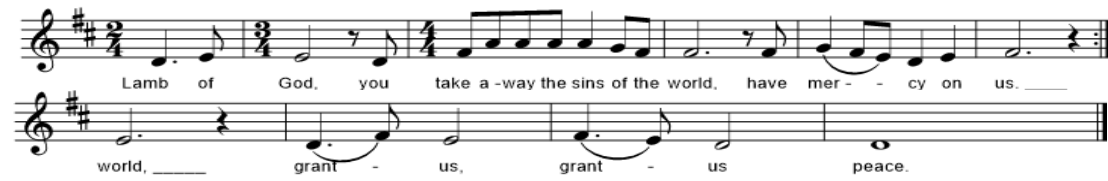

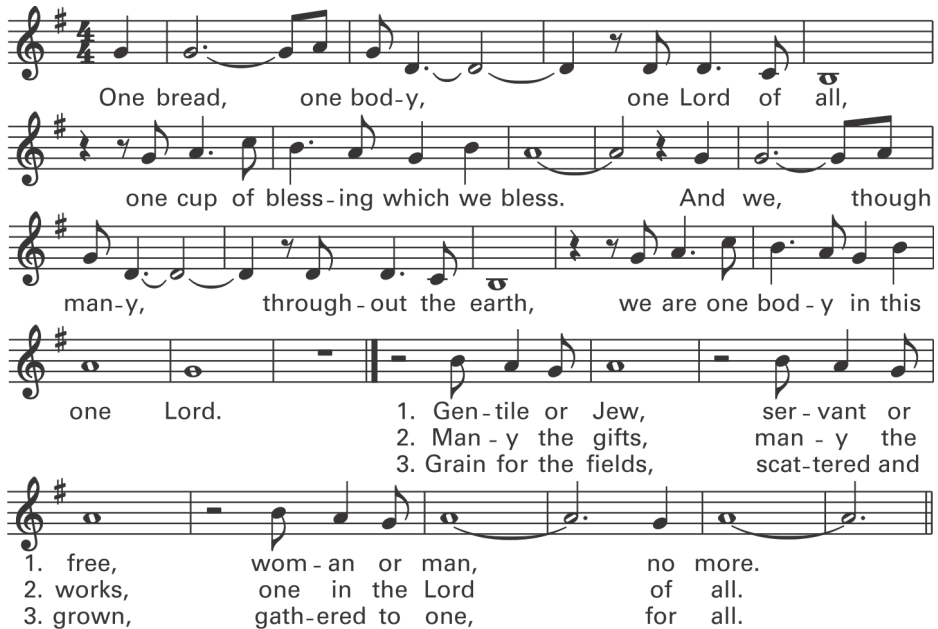
